Coincidence or Prophecy? Attalie Anne Drops Breakup Anthem "Table For Two" Amid Family Transition

PROVO, UT – On January 25th, rising indie-pop artist **Attalie Anne** will debut the music video for her new single, "**Table For Two**." The track explores the architecture of a relationship's end. The timing of the release is raising eyebrows following the public announcement of her mother Bettijo's high-profile divorce from actor Todd Bridges.

The 21-year-old singer-songwriter is the daughter of **designer Bettijo** and the stepdaughter of **actor Todd Bridges**. Following the couple's high-profile divorce announcement last week, it's a question if the haunting lyrics of "Table For Two" were a premonition. Despite the uncanny timing, Attalie clarifies that the song was written and recorded in early 2025, long before the family's recent changes.

"It's wild how life can imitate art," says Attalie. "I wrote 'Table For Two' as a creative study of heartbreak, but watching it release now feels like I accidentally wrote a premonition. While the song predates any of our recent family changes, the emotion of it definitely feels a lot closer to home than I ever expected."

Bettijo, the creative force behind the *Paging Supermom* brand and producer of the *DANG! Podcast*, among other joint projects with Bridges, is shifting her focus entirely to supporting her children's independent careers and her own new ventures.

"We've been working on this music video for a year. It was meant to be a creative exploration of a 'hypothetical' ending," Bettijo shares. *"I never imagined the timing would align so closely with our actual reality. It makes the final edit very difficult to watch, but incredibly powerful to share. I just hope it resonates with anyone else navigating a new chapter."*

The "Table For Two" music video was shot entirely in Utah, featuring a collaborative cast of Attalie's friends and students from Brigham Young University. Inspired by the state's creative "hotbed," Bettijo and her three younger children will be relocating to Utah this spring to be near Attalie.

About Attalie Anne: Attalie Anne previously composed the theme for the *DANG! Podcast*. Her debut EP, *Things I Said*, established her as a storyteller capable of turning "teenage awkwardness" into cinematic indie-pop. She is currently based in Provo, UT, where she continues to build her "wonderfully quirky" brand of music.
